

**Legislative Report
to CSSO Executive Board Meeting
MiraCosta College and CCC Conference
Oct. 30, 2009**

Bills signed or Vetoed by Governor

AB386-Signed: Although textbook publishers will be required to provide electronic versions of any printed texts they sell beginning in 2020, the community colleges will have no obligation to provide accommodation/captioning; add clarification to DSPS website.

AB669—Signed: Provides emancipated foster youth eligibility for residency. CSSO's supported and would encourage colleges to adopt.

AB1393-Signed: Gives CCC foster youth priority year-round housing at those campuses where available.

AB1400 –Vetoed: Measure that would have enabled local districts to determine admission eligibility of students who had been expelled from other districts on the basis of violent crime, including threats and stalking.

AB37-Signed: Grants eligibility for honorary degrees to Japanese-Americans interned during WWII. Need an honorary degree process for colleges, guidelines on how to move forward. Staff will ask for legal guidance on if and how to do, statewide policy or local policy.

AB187-Signed: This bill requires the Student Aid Commission to adopt regulations establishing a pilot program for an alternative Cal Grant delivery system under which a qualifying institution, if it elects to participate and meets specified requirements, would be authorized to voluntarily administer award grants under the Cal Grant A and B Entitlement Programs and the Community College Transfer Cal Grant Entitlement Program.
